The Neuroscience of Addiction and Treatment – Dr. Jennifer Sweeton

Presentation Objectives:

1. Name and describe the "addiction hub" of the brain.
2. Identify the structures of the brain that comprise the mesolimbic pathway in the brain.
3. State at least one technique that can help increase self-awareness and reduce relapse in clients.

About Dr. Sweeton

Originally trained as a neuroscientist, Dr. Jennifer Sweeton is a licensed clinical psychologist, best-selling author, and internationally-recognized expert on trauma, anxiety, and the neuroscience of mental health. She is the author of the book, [Trauma Treatment Toolbox](#), published by PESI Publishing & Media. Dr. Sweeton completed her doctoral training at the Stanford University School of Medicine, the Pacific Graduate School of Psychology, and the National Center for PTSD. Additionally, she holds a master's degree in affective neuroscience from Stanford University, and studied behavioral genetics at Harvard University.

Dr. Sweeton resides in the greater Kansas City area, where she owns a group private practice, [Kansas City Mental Health Associates](#), and co-owns [Mind Works Professional Education, Inc.](#), a continuing education company. She formerly served as the President of the Oklahoma Psychological Association, and holds adjunct faculty appointments at the University of Kansas School of Medicine and the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center. She is the past President of the Greater Kansas City Psychological Association. Dr. Sweeton offers psychological services to clients in Oklahoma, Kansas, and internationally, and is a sought-after trauma and neuroscience expert who has trained more than 10,000 mental health professionals in her workshops.

Is There a Pill for That? The State of Psychiatric Medications in 2019 - James Robert (Bob) Batterson, MD

Presentation Objectives:

1. State at least one psychiatric medication used for common disorders in children, adolescents and young adults.
2. Name a medication advance that has occurred in the past 5 years.
3. Identify an adverse reaction to medication, and the role of genetic testing for psychiatric medications.

About Dr. Batterson

Dr. Batterson is the Past Speaker of the Assembly of the American Psychiatric Association (APA), having ended his term in May 2019. He has been a member of the Board of Trustees of the APA and involved with the Assembly since 1999. He was born and raised in Kansas City, Missouri and attended medical school at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. He graduated in 1987 and trained in general psychiatry at the Medical University of South Carolina, then in child and adolescent psychiatry at Brown University in Providence, Rhode Island.

Dr. Batterson has been in private practice and was medical director of the inpatient child psychiatry unit at Trinity Lutheran Hospital before moving his practice to the Children's Mercy. Children's Mercy is a private charity hospital serving the region around Kansas City. He is the Chief of the Section of Psychiatry at the hospital as well as the Co-Director of the Tourette Clinic, which is recognized as a Center of Excellence by the national Tourette Association of America.

Opioid Use Disorders: Overview and Treatment Trends – Dr. Doug Burgess

Presentation Objectives:

1. Identify the rate and at least 1 trend in opioid use disorder.
2. Name 2 of the most effective interventions for opioid use disorder and how therapy providers can aid in facilitating treatment.
3. Identify ways stigma can impact access to treatment and successful outcomes and how to address it.

About Dr. Burgess

Dr. Burgess has been practicing as a psychiatrist at Truman Medical Centers since 2011. He completed his residency training at Duke University and a fellowship in addiction psychiatry at the Medical University of Southern Carolina in Charleston. Dr. Burgess is board certified in Psychiatry and Addiction Psychiatry.

Dr. Burgess is currently the Medical Director of Addiction Services and an assistant professor of psychiatry at the University of Missouri-Kansas City where he is active in medical student and residency education. He leads regional trainings related to mental health and substance use disorders. In addition, Dr. Burgess is the facilitator for the Missouri's Opioid Use Disorder ECHO group, which provides training and support for prescribers treating Opioid Use Disorders in Missouri and Kansas.

Poster Presentation Criteria:

Poster board surface area is 3' high and 6' wide.

Prepare a label indicating the title of your paper, and the author(s) for the top of your poster space.

The lettering for this section should not be less than 1" (2.54 cm or 72 point) high.

A copy of your abstract (300 words or less), in large typescript, should be posted in the upper lefthand corner of the poster board. Do not mount illustrations on heavy board because these may be difficult to keep in position on the poster board. Bear in mind that your illustrations will be viewed from distances of 3' (113 cm) or more. All lettering should be at least 3/8" (.95 cm or 27 point) high, preferably in a bold font, or if hand-lettered, written with a regular felt-tip pen (not fine-point). Be sure to provide a clear label for each section of your presentation.
